
MASTER'S DEGREES IN SPECIAL EDUCATION

Grand Canyon University offers several advanced graduate degrees for those with a passion for serving special education students. Programs are offered to prepare both current teachers experienced in special education and those with a bachelor's degree in an unrelated field to pursue teaching and licensure.

MASTER OF EDUCATION IN SPECIAL EDUCATION:

Graduates are equipped to meet the educational needs of K-12 students with mild to moderate disabilities and their families. This degree can be used to pursue teaching licensure for the first time or develop further skills in special education. The initial licensure program option includes 96 hours of observation and fieldwork and full-time, 15-week student teaching (if needed) with a certified special education teacher.

MASTER OF EDUCATION IN SPECIAL EDUCATION: MODERATE TO SEVERE

Graduates of the program are prepared to educate individuals with moderate to severe exceptionalities and implement individualized plans to accommodate their needs. The program prepares special education teachers with advanced capabilities. The Initial licensure form of the program include 96 observation and field work hours and student teaching (if needed) with a special education teacher of students with moderate to severe needs.
